We still have not found any anchor funders to help us replace the operational funding from UWGTYR that we are due to lose in 2018 and that is a big concern. Notwithstanding all of our supporters - new and old - who have heard our call and really helped out, we still need more.

Therefore, as you reflect upon your past year and think about the year upcoming I hope you will think of JFLT and support this agency to the maximum of your ability. UPDATE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

I am pleased to kick off 5777 by paying tribute to all who contributed to a most successful year at Jewish Free Loan Toronto. Special thanks go out to our dedicated volunteers, our outstanding office staff and, of course, to our generous donors. Your support is the foundation of this organization and the force which will enable us to meet the challenges of the future.

The primary challenge facing JFLT now is the rising demand for loans. Currently, we do not have sufficient capital to grant all the loans that deserve to be granted. Our fundraising goal for 5776 was \$250,000. Today, we sit at \$150,000.

This Rosh Hashanah, please give generously so that we will not be forced to turn away a single parent, an impoverished senior, a promising student, a new immigrant, or a childless couple.

JEWISH AGENCIES COOPERATE TO EASE IMMIGRANT ABSORPTION

Aleksandr and Ksenya are a young couple who recently immigrated to Toronto. After hearing about JFLT from their JIAS worker, they applied for a loan to purchase a car. In their own words:

"We are new immigrants to Canada who try to become a part of Canadian work labour and integrate to Canadian life style. This loan will help us to start our life in Canada. It is always great to know that in new country there are people who want to help and do it. A day after the interview we were happy to hear we got the loan and to learn about repayment. It is going to work for us perfect. We are so grateful for this opportunity."



JFLT HELPS SHUT-IN ENJOY LIFE

Esther is a 76 year old divorced woman who lives on a disability income as the result of a degenerative bone disease. After receiving a \$3,000 loan, she wrote to us saying:

"I can never thank you enough for giving me the loan. I bought a bed to replace the one I had been sleeping on for 20 years. I invested in a vacuum that eliminates the dust that clogs my breathing and I bought a new TV. Being in the house 24/7 is not easy, but now it is a little more pleasurable."



A LITTLE HELP GOES A LONG WAY



Bonnie, a single mother of two teenagers approached JFLT for help after remembering that her late mother had taken a loan years ago to pay for funeral costs. Here is what Bonnie had to say:

"I was in terrible shape.

I needed help for necessities like food and shelter. Free Loan, you really helped me out when I needed you the most, so I again thank you from the bottom of my heart."

THE KORA FUND


established by the Zukerman Family Foundation to cover first and last month's rent and for the purchase of basic furniture.

THE FIRST NARAYEVER FUND




