LOW-INCOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (LEAP)

Low-income customers can get up to \$500 in emergency assistance for their electricity bills (\$600 if your home is heated electrically) and \$500 for their natural gas bills. The assistance is only available if you are behind on your bill – or in arrears – and may face having your service disconnected. You cannot receive more money than you owe on your bill. Therefore, you may not receive the full amount of the grant. Emergency financial assistance is for emergency situations only and is not meant to provide you with ongoing help to pay your bills.

ONTARIO ELECTRICITY SUPPORT PROGRAM (OESP)

The OESP will reduce the cost of eligible households' electricity by applying a monthly credit directly to your bill. The credit amount will depend on how many people live in the home and combined household income.

Toronto Rent Bank provides interest-free repayable loans to low-income households facing eviction due to short-term financial difficulties. They may also help by coming up with a first and last month's rent through their Rental Deposit Loan. Staff will assess a client's long-term housing sustainability. A potential client will need to show that all other means of financial help available has been used up before applying for Rent Bank loan. All loans are to be paid back in full in monthly installments. Repayments go back into the Rent Bank fund to help others.
